The documentary presents the oeuvre of art historian Charles de Tolnay – Károly Tolnay, onetime director of Casa Buonarroti Museum in Florence and one of the most renowned experts on Michelangelo. The camera follows up on the major stations in Tolnay's life in Italy. While the scholar is talking about his discoveries on previously unknown archive recordings, the audience can have a look at the works of Michelangelo including ones which have not published in films so far.
