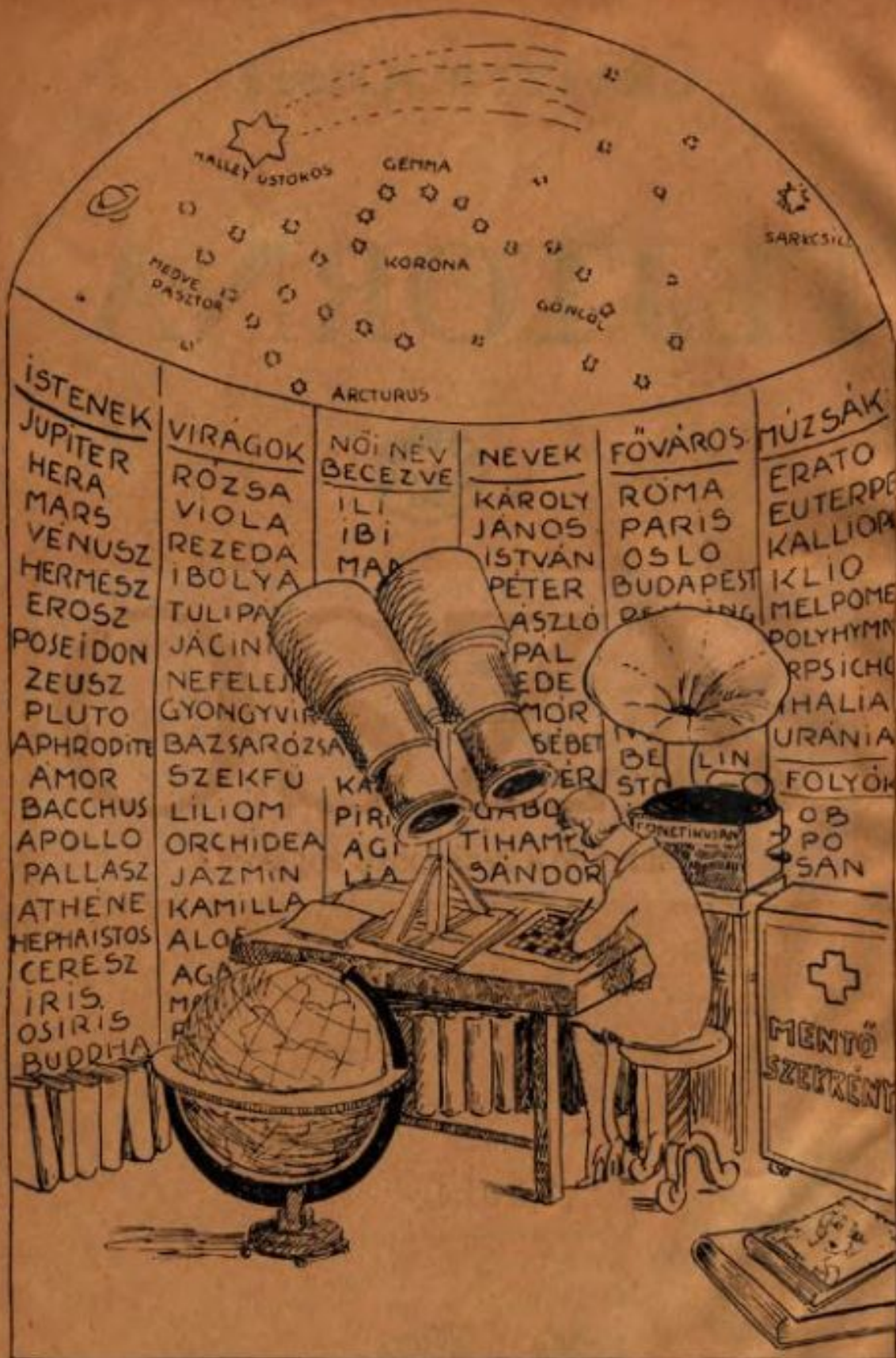


MEK 15,000!
