The article informs us that the tender was preceded by the [E-books on Demand](#) [2] initiative launched in 2008. As a member and leader of the work group no. 6, the most important task of our national library in the framework of the cooperation launched in 2019 is to design and develop a rights clearance documentation tool that is compatible with the national library's own systems and takes into account the interoperability requirements of the partner institutions, i.e. the interoperability of different IT systems.
